- Zip-top plastic bag
- Sharp pencils
- Water



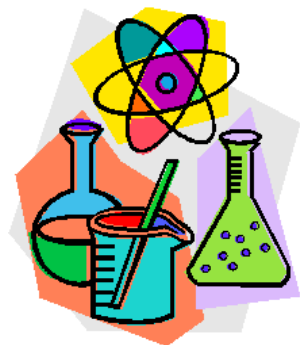
Instructions:
