





Reading

PowerPoint- Where do vegetables grow?

This week we are going to learn about where different fruit and vegetables grow. You can access the PowerPoint by clicking on 'Where do vegetables grow' underneath week beginning 11th May. Take time to read through this PowerPoint with your child. Look at the pictures on each slide and talk about what you can see.

Key questions to ask your child: *What can you see? What vegetables do you know? What fruit do you know? What is your favourite fruit/vegetable? Where do potatoes grow? Where do oranges grow? What was your favourite part of the PowerPoint?*



Reading is essential to your child's development.

Please read a story every evening before bed with your child.

Phonics

This week, we are learning the phoneme 'e'. Maybe your grown ups can help you learn the formation rhyme 'lift off the top and scoop out the egg'.. 'e' (e-e-egg). Have a go at writing the 'e' sound.

Eye spy

Play a game of eye spy in your home. What can you see?

Example: I spy with my little eye, something beginning with 'e'.

Possible answers: *egg, elbow, elephant, elf*

Practise using different sounds; s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k

Mathematics

Number- Counting (0-20)

- Go to your kitchen. Find 10 pieces of fruit/vegetables with your grown up (draw some if you need to) Number the fruit/vegetables 1-10. Mix the vegetables up- can you put them in order 1-10? Which number is the biggest? Which number is the smallest? What number comes after 10? If your child can do more- simply write out the numbers 1-20.
- Practise your number formation rhymes 0-9.

PSHE

Pass the 'talking teddy'

Choose a cuddly toy. Explain to your children the cuddly toy will now become a 'talking teddy'. Sit in a circle with your family and pass the teddy around. Whoever is holding the teddy bear has the power to talk. Make sure you all take a turn When you are holding the talking teddy bear you can talk about a different topic every day; how are you feeling today? What has been your favourite part of the day? What is your favourite toy? Why do you love your family? What do you miss about school?





Other Learning Opportunities

Make bubbles using water and washing up liquid

- Homemade obstacle courses in the garden
 - Bake with your family- measuring
 - Daily walks



- Write you name with paint
- Making music –Bottles filled with rice/pasta.
 - Build a castle using blocks/lego
 - Make you own vegetable insect
 - Make a farmer using recycling
 - Make your own puppet using a sock



- Can you tap out a beat using tubs and boxes? Can you sing some words to your beat?
 - Make an insect home with twigs, leaves from the garden!
- Put colours/ numbers around the garden- Can you jump/dance/spin to the number called?
 - Make your own Play-Dough – see separate *Messy Play* document
- Traffic light game- red: stop, orange: walk, green: run, speed bumps: jump, roundabout: spin, ice-skid, reverse: walk backwards



