## Mathematics



Show the children the numbered penguins. Can the children remember the number rhymes up to 5.

Show the children the 'Feed the Penguin' board.

Explain that the penguin needs feeding and that today we are going to give him treats.

Demonstrate how you first touch count the counters and then feed the penguin counting each one as it goes in. Ensure that you explain how you must say one number at a time and not just say the numbers in sequence.

### Freezing
